Thomas E. Mann is the W. Averell Harriman Chair and Senior Fellow in Governance Studies at The Brookings Institution. Between 1987 and 1999, he was Director of Governmental Studies at Brookings. Before that, Mann was executive director of the American Political Science Association. He earned his B.A. in political science at the University of Florida and his M.A. and Ph.D. at the University of Michigan. Mann is a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. He lectures frequently in the United States and abroad on American politics and public policy and is also a regular contributor to newspaper stories and television and radio programs on politics and governance. He is co-author with Norman Ornstein of *The Broken Branch: How Congress is Failing American and How To Get It Back on Track.* Mann and Ornstein co-directed the inaugural World Forum on Governance in Prague this past November and have just published *It's Even Worse Than It Looks: How the American Constitutional System Collided With the New Politics of Extremism.*
